The performance gap between the two frameworks stems from the thematic format's ability to support the complexity point on the rubric, which requires test-takers to evaluate multiple perspectives, contradictory evidence, or the evolution of historical events over time. For example, a prompt asking test-takers to evaluate the extent to which the American Revolution was "radical" can be addressed more effectively with a thematic format that dedicates one paragraph to radical political changes (e.g., new state constitutions, the Bill of Rights) and a second paragraph to limitations of radicalism (e.g., continued enslavement of Black people, exclusion of women from political rights), directly addressing the complexity requirement.
